## Letter of the Day/Week

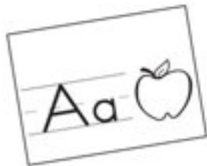
Each day or week, select a new Alphabet Note. Have your child say the letter, the letter sound, and the picture word. Then, have your child color the picture and post the note somewhere the child will see it often. Throughout the day, have your child practice writing the letter or point out objects that begin with the letter.

## ABC Hide & Seek

Label objects around your home with Alphabet Notes. Stick a note on an object that begins with the letter printed on the note. Allow your child to find the note, offering “hotter/cooler” guidance along the way. For each note found, have your child color the picture and display his/her work proudly on the refrigerator. Alternatively, have your child label objects that begin with the letter on the note and direct you to find the note.

## Matching Game

Cut Alphabet Notes in half, dividing each picture from the associated letters. Then, separate the pictures and letters—mount them on walls or hide them around the room. Let your child find each letter and the picture that matches it.



## Line 'Em Up

Stick a group of Alphabet Notes on the wall in random order. Then allow your child to put them in alphabetical order or line them up to spell out simple words or names of people in your family.

## On the Move ABC's

Stick one Alphabet Note inside the car door so that your child can see the letter. Then as you drive, have him/her spy the letter or objects passing by that begin with that letter. For each correct spotting, have your child draw a tally mark on the note. At the end of the trip, count how many sightings were made.

## Alphabet Book Activity

When you're done playing games with an Alphabet Note, stick it to a sheet of paper. Have your child practice writing the letter on the paper and draw objects that begin with the letter. After your child has created a sheet for each letter, stick the sheets together in alphabetical order to create your own alphabet book!
