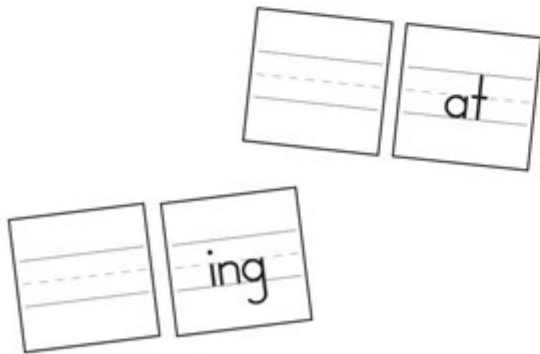

## Rhyme in Time

Select one word piece (phonogram) and stick the 5 Word Builder Notes to the wall. Then, have your child think of as many rhyming words that contain the posted phonogram as he/she can in a couple of minutes. To keep track of the words and/or ease rhyming, have your child write letters on the blank lined notes and stick them alongside the chosen phonogram. Leave the words on the wall and review them with your child later. Can you think of any more rhyming words?

## Stuck on Books

Select a Word Builder Note and a favorite story. As you read the story, stick the note nearby and have your child look for words containing the selected phonogram. Each time the phonogram is found, write the words containing the phonogram on a blank lined note. After the story is finished, you will have created a family of rhyming words.



## Word Builder

Select a phonogram and stick 5 notes on the wall. Then, refer to the package backcard for a list of common onsets (word beginnings). Have your child write onsets on several blank lined notes. To build words, tell your child to post the written onsets on the wall next to each phonogram (sh + op = shop).

## Word Wall

Teachers use Word Walls for daily reading practice of common words. After you play Word Builder games with your child, stick the words on a wall to create your own Word Wall. Each day, read the words on the Word Wall and try to think of additional rhyming words or associated words such as opposites or words beginning with the same letter. Write the new words on a blank lined note and add them to the Word Wall. Watch your child's vocabulary and reading skills grow as your Word Wall grows!
